Gundersen Moundview Hospital and Clinics Implementation Plan 2022 – 2024

Overview

Gundersen Moundview Hospital and Clinics was a collaborative partner in the 2021 Adams County Community Health Needs Assessment conducted by the Adams County Health and Human Services Division of Public Health. Public Health Departments are required to conduct a community health needs assessment and improvement plan every five years per state statutes. Hospitals are required to conduct a needs assessment and improvement plan every three years per the Affordable Care Act.

Prioritized Health Needs

The following health priorities were identified through the 2021 Adams County Community Health Needs Assessment:

- 1. Generational Cycle of Trauma and Abuse
- 2. Higher Wage Jobs
- 3. Dental Care
- 4. Alcohol and Drug Abuse
- 5. Healthy Eating Awareness and Knowledge

The partners involved in the needs assessment share a common vision of improving the health and well-being of those living within their communities. Each partner organization has different resources and abilities and may ultimately address the above identified health priorities differently, taking into consideration the needs assessment data and the organization's feasibility to drive realistic change.

Adams County Public Health identified four overarching health priorities they will address over the next five years including: 1) access to care; 2) alcohol and drug abuse; 3) nutrition and physical activity and 4) mental health.

Gundersen Moundview took into consideration the priorities chosen by public health, the needs assessment data, prioritized health needs and social determinants of health* when choosing the following priorities to address over the next three years:

- 1. Mental Health
- 2. Health Care Cost and Access (with consideration for dental care)
- 3. Substance Abuse
- 4. Workforce and Economic Development

Gundersen Moundview will make every effort to work collaboratively with public health and other community partners to address the priorities identified in the health needs assessment.

*Social determinants of health are the conditions in which people are born, grow, live, work and age. These include poverty, inadequate housing, food deserts, joblessness, underemployment and societal issues like violence and school performance. Social determinants of health contribute up to 80% of a person's health and well-being. Medical care accounts for the remaining 20%.

Implementation Plan

Gundersen Moundview Hospital and Clinics has developed the following plan to address the identified community health needs. The plan was approved by the hospital's board of directors on December 21, 2021. Gundersen Moundview will continuously review and evaluate these initiatives to ensure progress is made on the health priority areas. MENTAL HEALTH (including the Generational Cycle of Trauma & Abuse)

Overall Goal: Develop initiatives to improve the mental health of area residents, with a focus on decreasing the generational cycle of trauma and abuse. Reduce the average number of poor mental health days in the last 30 days to less than the 4.5 days reported in the 2021 county health rankings.

HEALTHCARE COST & ACCESS

Overall Goal: Improve health through preventative care and access, ultimately reducing the cost of healthcare. The goal is to show improvement over the 2021 county health rankings as follows: Decrease premature death rate (years of potential life lost before age 75 per 100,000 population, age adjusted, \leq 9,900), decrease physical inactivity (\leq 26%), decrease in obesity (\leq 32%), decrease food insecurity rates (\leq 12%), increase mammography screenings (\geq 43%), and decrease adult smoking rates (\leq 23%).

WORKFORCE & ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Overall Goal: Increase the county's median household income *(currently \$46,369)* and decrease the median workforce age *(currently 52.6 years)*. This is a long-term goal, not likely to be attained in three years. Gundersen Moundview will work with community partners on initiatives to attract/keep younger residents and families and encourage future business development. Low wage jobs/poverty is frequently listed as a county priority. Poverty is a known contributor to poor health behaviors and issues.
