

Despite a national vacancy rate for nurses at 10%, our vacancy rate has continually decreased over the past two years and has remained below 5% for the past year. This achievement places us in the top 5% nationwide. How do our nurses create an environment where their colleagues want to stay?

We do this through innovative orientation and onboarding programming that provides individualized, wrap-around support. We are also committed to implementing cutting edge care models like Virtual Nursing and a re-design of our Medical Specialty Unit. We keep the experience of our nurses top of mind in our programming and strategy.

Our support extends to nursing students as well. Throughout our system, nurses share their expertise with over 800 nursing students each year. Our nurses foster a supportive learning environment where students can take what they learned on the pages of their textbooks and translate them to professional nursing practice.

At the La Crosse Hospital, we've expanded successful roles such as patient attendants and virtual nurses. This ensures our bedside nurses have the time to do what it is they do best: be present with our patients, listen to their needs and co-create individualized care plans.





A Destination Workplace for Staff and Students

In our clinics, we continue to focus on preventative care and consider all factors that impact health. Whether it's following up on high blood pressure or ensuring a patient has the resources they need to quit smoking, our nurses excel at partnering with patients and their caregivers to improve their health and well-being.



We prioritize the professional development of our nurses ensuring advances in care are available to all our patients. We are proud that whether our patients live in a community of 50 or 50,000, they receive consistent, top-notch care anywhere in our service area. Our rural health nurses possess a wide variety of skills and knowledge, with strong critical thinking abilities. They have the opportunity to work to the top of their scope of practice and care for their community in unique and innovative ways.





The force behind it all is the power of our nurses; the preceptors, mentors, break buddies and charge nurses. They commit each shift to living out our values of belonging, respect, excellence, accountability, teamwork and humility. Through their efforts, they create an outstanding work experience for new and seasoned staff alike.



Project Fusion

Technology has profoundly transformed the nursing profession, as it has in many other fields. For over a year, our dedicated nurses have played a crucial role in our efforts to enhance our Electronic Health Record (EHR) systems through Project Fusion, which merges our EHR with the Bellin Region. Merging EHR systems will enable more consistent, standardized, and efficient care between our two regions. With representation on over 40 workgroups, nurses from across the organization contribute their expertise to optimize the EHR, ensuring it accurately reflects our patients and populations, benefiting both our care teams and system partners. Leading the way for many of our nursing workgroups is our outstanding team of Informatics Nurses, who have specialized expertise in ensuring our use of technology adds value and enhances the overall experience for our nursing staff.

Through detailed investigations into best practices, nurses on the project are working to ensure that interactions with the EHR translate into more quality time with patients and improved clinical care. This transformation aligns with the project's core principles of putting patients first, fostering innovation, and emphasizing data-driven decision-making. By leveraging technology, our nurses are improving workflows while reinforcing their commitment to compassionate, patient-centered care. Additionally, this project has provided our nurses with the opportunity to build relationships with their colleagues from the Bellin Region.

As we approach the go-live date for the Gundersen Region this summer, over 400 nurses have been selected as Super Users for the project. These Super Users will utilize their strong communication skills, problem-solving abilities, EHR knowledge, and additional training to provide an enriching training and go-live experience for our nursing staff.





Virtual Nursing

Virtual nursing is a care model rapidly growing in use cases as an inpatient strategy that has transformed care for staff, patients and families. This care model leans into technology by having an experienced RN, from our own system, just a moment away. Virtual nurses take on the practice of acute nursing that does not require a physical presence including admissions, patient education, discharge support, patient safety monitoring and more. This model has the capability to help our staff focus, connect, and be more available to patients and each other. It has also created efficiencies in patient care, improved patient safety, mitigated the complexity/experience gap between staff, and has improved the connection between the care team, patients, family, and each other. As we reflect back on the first year of virtual nursing, it's hard to believe that we've spent more time virtually with patients than there are hours in a year.



Calls from a virtual nurse into the patient's room may include any of the following tasks:



Hospital Admission
Hospital Discharge
Patient Education
Overnight Rounding

Mentorship of fellow nurses

Second nurse verification for high risk medications


